



All exhibits must be picked up during the following times:



You may enter your pet in any and all of the appropriate categories. Dogs must be on a leash; cats must be on a leash or in a carrier. Only controllable pets should be entered. Animals that have been judged in the livestock, small animal or horse shows or in pens may not be shown in the pet show. 1st, 2nd and 3rd places will be selected in each division category. 1st Place winners in each division category will compete for division Champion. These Champions will compete for Grand Champion Pet. Premiums: 1st - \$4.00, 2nd-\$3.50, 3rd - \$3.00.

**GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS REGARDING EXHIBITS
OF THE PEARL RIVER COUNTY LIVESTOCK SHOW**

All participants must either be a Pearl River County resident or enrolled in Pearl River County 4-H or a school/home school in Pearl River County.

HEALTH

CATTLE

Cattle originating from Mississippi will require an official health certificate only. These cattle are exempt from Brucellosis and Tuberculosis tests. All cattle except nursing calves must be individually identified on the health certificate. No entry permit is required.

HORSES

All horses shall be accompanied by an original negative Coggins test made within twelve (12) months. Photocopies WILL NOT be accepted.

SWINE

All swine shall be accompanied by an official health certificate. Swine must originate from herds that have not had an infectious or communicable disease within the past 90 days prior to movement, and this statement must be written on the health certificate.

SHEEP AND GOATS

All sheep and goats shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and shall comply with the following:

- A. Originate from herds that are not quarantined for any contagious or communicable disease.
- B. Free of scabies, lice, and foot rot.
- C. Sheep must have an official Scrapie ear tag issued by the USDA.
- D. Goats must have an official Scrapie ear tag, unless registered and have a tattoo in the ear.

OWNERSHIP

All animals competing must be entered in the name of the exhibitor, except where notated under individual departments.

SUPERINTENDENTS AND JUDGES

The superintendent(s) of each department, together with the show management, will pass on the qualifications of exhibits. Their decision will be final.

The show management reserves the right to interpret rules and regulations governing the show and to amend rules, when such changes will benefit the general interest of the show. Their ruling will be final.

LIABILITY

The show management and the Pearl River County Fair Committee will not be responsible in any way for damages incurred to herd owners or visitors during the show. Neither will they be responsible for any damage or injury incurred by animals placed on exhibit or to any animals while on exhibit. However, the management will make every possible effort to avoid any injury among livestock.

The show management and the Pearl River County Fair Committee will not be responsible for any damage or theft of automobiles or trailers, or their contents while said automobiles and trailers are parked on the grounds of the show.

PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

1. Champion and reserve champion animals will only be selected from blue ribbon winners.
2. Premiums will be paid according to the list in this catalog, provided sufficient funds are available.

ENTRIES AND EXHIBITORS

1. All participants must either be a Pearl River County resident or enrolled in Pearl River County 4-H or a school/home school in Pearl River County.
2. Exhibitors will provide feed for their animals and keep clean bedding in place.
3. All animals must be in place by the time stated in the program.
4. All animals exhibited in the registered classes must be accompanied by registration papers in the name of the exhibitor, except where notated under individual departments.
4. All exhibits, to be eligible for prize money, must be kept on exhibit until the time stated in the program.
6. Exhibitors will be responsible for transporting exhibits to and from the show.
7. All animals on exhibit must be broken to lead and show at halter.
8. All bulls must have a nose lead.

REGULATIONS

1. This department shall include all beef, dairy, sheep, goat, and swine exhibits owned and exhibited by the youth of Pearl River County or youth enrolled in Pearl River County 4-H or a school/home school in Pearl River County.
2. All animals in this division must be broken to lead and show at halter. Exhibitors with an uncontrollable animal may be asked to remove that animal at the discretion of the ring man.
3. Each entry must be shown by owner, except where exhibitor is showing more than one animal in the same class.
4. All registered animals must be accompanied by registration papers in the name of the exhibitor.
5. Only blue ribbon winners first in their class will compete for champion and reserve champion in the respective breed.
6. There must be a minimum of 2 blue ribbon animals for championship competition.
7. Champion and reserve champion in a class and junior and senior champion awards will be given to registered and commercial animals.
8. Any exhibitor who owns and is showing an animal in the show is eligible to compete in showmanship. There will be four age divisions – pee wee (ages 7 & under), cloverleaf (ages 8-10), junior (ages 11-13), and senior (ages 14-18). Ages are determined as of January 1. First - \$10.00 and rosette; second - \$7.50; third - \$5.00.
9. All cattle champion winners will be eligible to compete in Supreme Overall Heifer and Bull classes. Exhibitors showing the only entry in a breed will also be eligible to compete.

BEEF DEPARTMENT

DIVISION I. STEERS

1. Steers must be polled or dehorned and must have state issued ear tags.
2. Premiums will be awarded as follows: Blue - \$25.00, Red - \$20.00, and White - \$15.00. Champions and reserve champions will receive same awards as registered animals.

DIVISION II. COMMERCIAL BEEF HEIFERS

1. Commercial heifers will be shown as follows:
Class 1 – Brahman influence
Class 2 – Non-Brahman influence

2. Premiums will be awarded as follows: Blue - \$25.00, Red - \$20.00, and White - \$15.00. Champions and reserve champions will receive same awards as registered animals.
3. Heifers must have their milk teeth, and no heifer will show that does not have milk teeth. Heifers must be polled or dehorned.
4. Heifers must have state issued ear tags.

DIVISION III. REGISTERED BEEF CATTLE

1. Grand champion prizes will be rosettes. Reserve grand champion prizes will be rosettes.
2. Premiums will be awarded as follows: Blue - \$25.00, Red - \$20.00, and White - \$15.00.

DIVISION IV. DAIRY CATTLE

1. All registered dairy animals will be judged according to breed standards.
2. Commercial dairy cattle will be shown in divisions by weight.
3. No dairy bulls will be shown.
4. Premiums will be awarded as follows: Blue - \$25.00, Red - \$20.00, and White - \$15.00.
5. Grand champion prizes will be rosettes. Reserve grand champion prizes will be rosettes.
6. Blue ribbon first place winners in each class will be judged for champion and reserve champion for each breed (junior and senior divisions).
7. Dairy cattle will be judged according to the following breeds: Jersey, Holstein, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, and Ayrshire.

1. All exhibits must comply with general rules and regulations of the livestock department.
2. Premiums will be awarded as follows: Blue - \$10.00, Red - \$7.50, and White - \$5.00.

All market swine will be entered in the appropriate weight division classes. The number of division classes will be determined by the number of entries and by the weights of the entries.

DIVISION VII-A. POULTRY EXHIBITED IN PENS

1. Poultry will be judged, and premiums will be awarded as follows: Blue - \$4.00, Red - \$3.50, and White - \$3.00.
2. Chickens may be exhibited as **Breed Specific, Mixed, or Other Breed**. Indicate standard size with S or bantam size with B. Exhibit entries will be accepted on Tuesday from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

6. Exhibitors must provide feed and water for their animals.
7. Exhibits will be released on Saturday at 4:00 p.m. Exhibits removed before 4:00 p.m. on Saturday will forfeit their premiums.

DIVISION VII-B. RABBITS EXHIBITED IN PENS

1. Rabbits will be judged, and premiums will be awarded as follows: Blue - \$4.00, Red - \$3.50, and White - \$3.00.
2. Rabbits may be exhibited as single or pair. Exhibit entries will be accepted on Tuesday from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m.
3. Exhibitors must provide feed and water for their animals.
4. Exhibits will be released on Saturday at 4:00 p.m. Exhibits removed before 4:00 p.m. on Saturday will forfeit their premiums.

DIVISION VII-C. POULTRY EXHIBITED IN SHOW

1. Premiums will be awarded as follows: Blue - \$10.00, Red - \$7.50, and White - \$5.00.
2. Grand Champion prizes will be rosettes.
3. Poultry will be shown in the following size groups:
 1. Standard (regular large breed of poultry)
 2. Bantam (miniature chickens usually one-fourth to one-fifth the weight of regular chickens)
4. Poultry in each size group will be shown in the following age group classes:
 1. Senior (over 12 months of age)
 2. Junior (under 12 months of age)
5. Males will compete against males, and females will compete against females.

HORSE DEPARTMENT

DIVISION VIII. HORSES

1. All participants must either be a Pearl River County resident or enrolled in Pearl River County 4-H or a school/home school in Pearl River County.
2. Entries will be taken all day during the show for any events not yet held. **If entry form is incomplete, no premiums will be paid.**
3. No stallions will be shown.
4. Exhibitors may show no more than 2 animals per halter class.
5. Entries may be grade or registered.
6. All horses must be properly trained and safely controlled.
7. Exhibitor must show registration papers on registered horses.
8. Exhibitor may show a horse that is registered in another person's name.
9. Premiums will be awarded as follows: 1st place - \$12.00, 2nd place - \$10.00, 3rd place - \$8.00, 4th place - \$6.00, and 5th place - \$4.00. High Point Champion Rider in each division will receive \$12.00. Each Ribbon Pull and Arena Race (ages 7 & under) participant will receive a blue ribbon and a \$3.00 premium.
10. High Point Champion Rider will be awarded to the rider who has accumulated the most points in each age division for the entire show. The rider is not required to ride the same horse in all events. There will be three age divisions - cloverleaf (ages 7 & under), junior (ages 8-13), and senior (ages 14-18). Ages are determined as of January 1.
11. Current Coggins papers will be checked. No photocopies will be accepted.
12. **Helmets are strongly recommended for all riding events; however, they are not mandatory.**
13. Exhibitors will ride at their own risk.
14. Exhibitors may only participate in one goat tying event, either unmounted or mounted.
15. In the goat tying events, exhibitors will have 30 seconds to tie the goat, and the goat's legs must remain crossed and secure for 6 seconds after completion of the tie.
16. For the safety of the exhibitors and spectators, a closed gate finish will be used for timed events.
17. Exhibitors must wear collared shirts, jeans, and boots for all events.
18. Horses and ponies will compete against each other in all classes except halter.
19. Any protests and/or discretions will be brought before the show superintendent for ruling.
20. All events will comply with general rules and regulations of the Mississippi 4-H Horse Program.




WESTERN HORSEMANSHIP (7 & UNDER)

Rules:

1. Exhibits may be entered by any Pearl River County resident. All members of Pearl River County 4-H, FFA, and other youth enrolled in a school or home school in Pearl River County are considered to be in Pearl River County and are eligible to exhibit.
2. All exhibits must be owned by and be the work of the exhibitor.
3. A first, second, and third place will be awarded for each exhibit grouping. (Example: All etchings will be judged, and one first, one second, and one third place will be awarded and receive premiums. Exceptions: Each exhibit in the 7 years and under booth will receive a ribbon and a premium. Upon the judges' discretion, more than one item in each exhibit grouping may receive a first, second, or third place ribbon and premium.)
4. Youth exhibits will be judged according to age divisions.
5. Only exhibits of standard quality will be displayed. If there is no competition in a class, premium will be paid according to quality. **No premiums will be paid for poor or unworthy exhibits.**
6. Premiums will be paid according to judges' documentation and not according to ribbons, since ribbons may become misplaced.
7. Exhibits must be checked in and out. Each exhibit will be judged in its own class.
8. Each exhibit must have an official color-coordinated entry tag. **Green** tags will be used for 4-H'ers, **white** for other youth, and **yellow** for adults. Entry tags must be properly attached. A tagging station will be provided for exhibitors to tag their items according to the fair list before bringing them to the registration table.
9. Each exhibitor must complete an official color-coordinated Exhibits Form listing all exhibits entered in the County Fair in order by the exhibits list. **Green** forms will be used for 4-H'ers, **white** for other youth, and **yellow** for adults. This form must be submitted at the time of entering exhibits. A copy of the form will be returned to assist the exhibitor when picking up exhibits.
10. All premiums will be paid to individual exhibitors.
11. **Only one** entry for each item on the exhibit list may be made by an individual, unless otherwise indicated.
12. Lego model exhibits need to be attached to a base.
13. All canned foods must be in standard jars with official labels on the outside of the jar.
14. All freshly cooked foods must be placed on disposable plates and wrapped in clear, colorless cellophane or placed inside a clear zipper sealed bag for sanitary reasons. **Recipes must be attached to youth exhibits.**
15. All earrings, necklaces, bracelets, other small items and any item smaller than 5" x 5" **MUST** be placed in clear zipper sealed bags. If not, the exhibit will **NOT** be accepted. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
16. Exhibits must have been completed since the previous fair.
17. The Superintendents will not be responsible for lost exhibits.
18. Youth exhibits selected for the State Fair 4-H Village must belong to a 4-H'er and must be on the State 4-H Village list. Adult exhibits chosen for State Fair must follow State Fair rules. If you are interested in exhibiting in the State Fair, please call the Pearl River County Extension Service Office at (601) 403-2280 for a copy of the appropriate list(s).

Notice: Exhibits will be released from 9:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. on Monday, September 29, 2025. Exhibits not picked up by exhibitor during the designated time will be disposed of, and premiums will be forfeited. NO EXCEPTIONS!


